ORONADO Island in Southern California is the island Disney would have made, had he created one. There's something unreal in its perfection. It's palm-fringed. between bay and ocean. And its streets are clean enough to eat off there are \$1,000 fines for littering. Getting here doesn't require a boat either. It's connected to mainland San Diego by the soaring Coronado Bridge -

The only time the sky turns grey is when the occasional fighter jet passes over. Plus, it was developed in the 1880s as a playground for the wealthy, and that's how it feels still. yet it's still possible to have a budget holiday there. U.S stars and stripes flags flutter outside retirees' homes and children walk dogs. It's not hard to imagine Anne Of Green Gables or Desperate Housewives-style lives being led behind the facades of its Colonial Revival houses, Spanish villas and clapperboard bungalows. Maybe the Wicked Witch resides

inside the residence where Baum wrote The Wizard Of Oz series. Among these houses in a quiet residential street is the 1906 Lodge, a turn-of-the-century
