
## 17 BEST FOR WATER BABIES Cliveden, Berkshire

With the recent re-pebbling of the driveway at this Palladian villa, another step in the mansion's overhaul is complete. The Livingstone brothers, who took over the hotel, are serious about maintaining the magnificence of the Astors' former home. For all its grandeur, the atmosphere is welcoming. This is a house that revels in a good time, even if we might not remember the Profumo scandal that rocked Harold Macmillan's government in 1963. ## 18 BEST FOR THE IMPULSIVE Dean Street Townhouse, London

Check in here impromptu and without luggage and you'll find not only a toothbrush in your room, but also razors, moisturiser, mouthwash, a scented candle, a hot-water bottle, flip-flops, a kettle, biscuits, a torch and a brolly. And what a relief to find a hotel room that oozes such old-fashioned cosiness and unpretentious style. You can sink into a beaten-up leather chair and listen to a Roberts radio. The curtains open simply on a pulley cord, and the electrics work at the flick of a switch. Reassuringly low-tech and anti-design, Dean Street Townhouse is a comfortingly charismatic member of the Soho House empire.

## 19 BEST FOR SMOKERS The Wellesley, London

'Cigardens' – gardens for cigar lovers – are all the rage in London's newest hotels. The Wellesley, the capital's latest boutique hotel, offers a smoking room that is a topiary enclave overlooking Hyde Park. Giuseppe Ruo (formerly of the Lanesborough) spent over five years building an extensive collection of cigars, which are sold individually from the humidor. ## 20 BEST FOR ART-LOVERS Houghton Hall, Norfolk

Don't miss 'Houghton Revisited', an exhibition of 70 masterpieces, including works by Rubens, Rembrandt and Velázquez. They're being returned from St Petersburg to Houghton Hall - the country pile of the Marquess of Cholmondeley - after 234 years. Houghton, with its 106 rooms and 4,000 acres, is now home to the Earl, his wife, the heir and a spare. Stay in the Water House, a red-brick estate cottage on the edge of the deer park, and enjoy the award-winning walled garden and sculpture park. Hire a Bentley and tour the area in the style of the Belle Epoque heiress Sybil Sassoon, a one-time Houghton resident. Take Holkham Beach walks, and eat just-caught lobster and local samphire in beach shacks.
